

**City of Cody**  
**Council Proceedings**  
**Tuesday, March 14, 2023**

A Work Session of the Cody City Council was held in the Council Chambers at City Hall on March 14, 2023 at 5:30 a.m.

Present: Mayor Matt Hall, Council Members Andy Quick, Emily Swett, Kelly Tamblyn Lee Ann Reiter, Don F. Shreve Jr., Barry Cook, City Administrator, Scott Kolpitke, City Attorney and Cindy Baker, Administrative Services Officer.

Mayor Hall called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Doug Weedon provided the Governing Body with an update relating to the Pickle Ball Courts, including revenue and expenditures of the project and status of items yet to be completed. No action was taken.

Todd Stowell, City Planner provided information relating to City property adjacent to the Dominck property off the Meeteetse Highway. Staff was directed to move forward with a lease document and bring to the Council for consideration at a future meeting.

James Klessens, Forward Cody, provide the Governing Body with a quarterly update on projects Forward Cody has or is working on. No action was taken.

Rick Manchester, Parks and Rec Director provided the Governing Body information relating to MOU's with various organizations utilizing the baseball and/or softball fields. Staff was directed to provide the MOU's at the next Council meeting for consideration to approve.

Rick Manchester, Parks & Rec Director provided the Governing Body with information on the Bathroom/structure to be built in the vicinity of the Splash Park at Mentock Park. Staff was directed to provide the professional services agreement at the next council meeting for consideration of approval.

Chief Baker provided the Governing Body with information relating to Asset Forfeiture funds, the funds available, limitations on how those funds can be spent and information on a request he will be bringing to the next meeting for consideration of approval.

Que Blair, Cody Fireworks Committee provided the Council with some background information and history on the Fourth of July Fireworks, that the Chamber would no longer be coordinating the event including the fund raising. Thus, this committee was formed late 2022 with the efforts of continuing this event. Que was requesting the council consider a donation of \$10,000. Staff was directed to put this on the next council meeting for consideration and provide the council with option of how to fund if donation is approved.

The Governing Body was provided updates on the following Boards or Committees:  
Parks & Recreation Liaison meeting, Cody Country Chamber of Commerce, Contractor's Board, Shoshone Recreation District and Park County Travel Council.

There being no further discussion, the meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
